Many American families gather for Thanksgiving, a day to share food, family memories, and gratitude for both. The arrival of early settlers

and the colonization of North America is part of our shared history as Americans. It is important to learn and remember the full history of colonization and the reality that it included centuries of genocide, the theft of land, and oppression. As a result, Indigenous Peoples recognize Thanksgiving as a day of mourning. It is a time to remember ancestral history as well as a day to acknowledge and protest the racism and oppression which they continue to experience today. Since 1970 there has been a gathering at the Plymouth rock historic site in Massachusetts on Thanksgiving Day to commemorate the National Day of Mourning. The United American Indians of New England will host the 54th Annual National Day of Mourning on November 23, 2023. There have been a number of books published by Indigenous authors to share Indigenous perspectives for both adults and children in a variety of topics. First Nations publishes a list of essential reading for anyone interested in learning about the Native American experience. Two notable titles about Thanksgiving are, for adults, This Land Is Their Land: The Wampanoag Indians, Plymouth Colony, and the Troubled History of Thanksgiving by David J. Silverman, and for children, 1621: A New Look at Thanksgiving by Margaret M. Bruchac (Abenaki) and Catherine Grace O'Neill.

Dwa Brown has been a musician and Native American activist as well as an advocate for the disabled and elders in our area for several decades. This past Friday, she collapsed from some major medical issues and as a result, had to be airlifted from Bemidji to Sanford



clinic in West Fargo, North Dakota. She is currently in the ICU. She is showing signs of improvement and is communicating with her loved ones but her recovery will be a long hard journey. Her and her family do need your support. This Saturday, we will be having a walleye fish fry to help raise money to alleviate some of the cost for her and her loved ones. Benefit will start at 2pm and will go until 6pm. There will be live entertainment along with a meal and several donated items that will be raffled off. People can donate items for the raffle by simply dropping them off here at the bar or if you would like further information on how to help the family, feel free to contact our inbox on the Facebook bar page or newsletter page. Please come out and show your support for this amazing woman and her family! There will also be a Go Fund Me page set up to help defray the costs for her and her family. If you are unable to make it out to Little Bobby's this Saturday, there will be another benefit for her held at Log Jammerz in Cass Lake on Nov. 25th from 2pm to close.



Some of you may not be aware, but there is a new service available to veteran's in the area. DTOM 22/0 Foundation and Veteran's Ranch is a Non-Profit that recently moved its headquarters to Bagley. DTOM is a military acronym that stands for Don't Tread On Me. The meaning dates back to before the founding of our nation, when in 1775 the Navy used it as the first Navy Jack. The 22 stands for the recognized average of 22 Veterans per day dying from suicide. The 0 represents our goal. When you add up the average circle of friends and family that affects EVERYDAY it comes to 2,860, PER DAY! They are working on building up families and the support structure to help our Heroes find their purpose again to show these people how important they are. As a people, we must come together and find other ways to end this plague within our Military! What is being done now is not enough and we cannot continue to let them be taken from us. Saying "Thank You" is NOT enough. With all they have sacrificed, it is our DUTY to take care of them. The mission of the DTOM 22/0 Foundation and Veterans Ranch is to provide a safe place for healing and recovery for military service members, veterans, and their families while encouraging engaging, and positively impacting their lives through hope, self-conviction, and family activities, while helping them learn to live again with purpose. Their vision is to end suicide among our service men and women, through mentorship, support, and building stronger families.
